
We hope you'll choose to stick with us and give courageously out of a love most luminous.



These impact numbers below represent your commitment to doing good and standing alongside the partners and communities we serve around the world as they continue their fight to end poverty forever.



Families (61,820 individuals) were impacted daily through Help One Now programs.



Local Leader Interview: Julie & Nigel Miguel

Help One Now empowers local leaders through friendship and partnership. We work with leaders who are already working effectively in their respective communities. These leaders are our friends and partners on the journey to end extreme poverty. They are our greatest resource, and sustainable change is impossible without them.

We recently sat down with Belize local leaders, Julie and Nigel Miguel. In this interview, they reflect on the progress of their ministry, how empowering families has impacted their community, and their vision for the next year and beyond. We hope their words are as inspiring and hope-giving to you as they were for us!

What led you to start your ministry in Belize, especially when it comes to empowering families through business?

(Julie) We started our program in 2012. It was an outreach ministry to our community, where we served families living under the margins. This ministry got started because of the children. We noticed that they were playing and living in the streets and had no direction. We decided that we wanted to do something about it, and it just grew from there. We saw the needs, and we tried to fill them. So every day, it was addressing the needs of this community. We had an after-school program for the kids to help them with their homework, but we realized that we needed to get the families involved at some point. So we started inviting the families to the center for different kinds of lectures and activities, and we went out into the neighborhood and met them where they were.



And from there, we knew we needed to find a way for the families to help themselves, and that's where the Family Business Program came in. When we empower a family, getting them set up in their business doesn't take much. For them, it's just to have that opportunity for the capital startup. They have the mindset and the desire to succeed! They want someone to listen to them and their dreams. And for us to meet that dream, it's just a fantastic feeling for us. To know that once I accept an application from them and they finish the program, I can look them in the eye and tell them that they are funded! And that is, well, it's like a miracle. It's a true miracle.

What are some ways you have seen your work create a lasting impact in the community?

(Nigel) It's been very powerful. In the community we work in, Julie's word is bond. It's like gospel. She holds our work to a high standard, and when we're able to deliver with that, it makes a significant impact here. You know, Belize is a small community; everybody knows everybody. The residual effect of the work is amazing. When you have someone in the program, and they bring you another person, the impact spreads out more and affects more families. There are other programs in the community, like government aid and other small things. However, many people come to the community and just give lip service. It might alleviate some situations, but it doesn't create lasting change. But Water Walker's, in partnership with Help One Now, delivers. We get to live out the day-to-day with families and see it through for the long haul. Your partnership has made it easier to fulfill our promises and ensure families can support themselves.



Can you give us an example of a family who has flourished because of the Family Business Program?

(Julie) We have several entrepreneurs who have thrived and excelled beyond our expectations, but one lady stands out named Dotsie. She was one of the first members of the program that started in 2019. She started out with a small bakery cart that she would take out to sell every day to the main street of the city. As she increased her sales, she reinvested her profits to start a used clothing business. She has now hired another employee to run that business for her, and she reinvested again to use her bakery to make and sell pizza. So she has already grown to own 3 different businesses! I admire her so much. She's an incredible woman with an incredible success story. She's the head of her home and is taking care of her daughters and six grandchildren while they create a better life for themselves. She is paying for their school and helping her daughters learn and start their own businesses as well. It just took one little spark, and now she's going off like wildfire!

What are your biggest dreams for the future of the Family Business Program in Belize?

(Julie) So far, we have empowered 87 small businesses, and we're hoping to do an additional 50-65 in the next year. I believe that the impact that we've already made in this community is enormous. The community is so small, you know, so the money is changing the whole community. I think that's great, and we would love to expand that impact into the entire nation of Belize.



(Nigel) You can see the difference the Family Business Program has made not only financially but also in how the people with businesses carry themselves. They've become better citizens, and they're no longer relying on the system. Knowing people when they first came into the center and seeing them transform to where they are now is totally different. Getting to walk alongside them financially and spiritually as they take their journey and their story unfolds plays a significant role. So this program is affecting the beliefs and outlook of the community on numerous levels. It's community first, but we're also making better citizens for the country of Belize. The program allows us to bridge the cracks that these folks usually fall through, and as long as we're lightening the load on the system, that means the system can go out and help more and more people. And then, at some point, if we continue helping people to help themselves, we won't even need the system anymore. The entire country could be thriving on its own.

What has partnership and friendship with Help One Now meant to you?

(Nigel) The program and our work together have enriched our lives. Just the interaction with the people and getting to know you guys. These are all like extras, you know, perks that when you're in the mix, you don't think about them. But when you can actually step outside and just smell the roses, you see how much this partnership has enriched our lives. I would like to say thank you. We always talk about someone else seeing our vision, and even though it's our vision, you need a team to help you get it to become a reality. So we want to say thank you for that. Because without the partnership, this doesn't happen the way it's happened. And it's huge because I can look back and see how we built on this. We always want to see it grow, and it's just amazing. Where it's come from, to where it is, and then to where it's going.

(Julie) I would not have thought in my wildest dreams when I embarked on this work that we would be supported like this. This community that we are building and the work we are doing are because of you guys. You know, the U.S. Embassy in Belize honored me and referred to me as "Superwoman." I never thought about myself that way, but after the award, I believed it - I do get to be a Superwoman! But they don't know that the wings I have, you know, the people carrying me. I will forever be grateful for this because there's not a program in Belize that does anything close to what we do together. We're just very blessed to have the support system behind us. I mean, this is just incredible. We're trailblazers in Belize together!

All empowered families develop a 'can do' and 'I can change' attitude and have succeeded in their private and public lives. At Help One Now, we are not just running programs; we are changing lives for the better.

In a year when economic conditions were tough, we are proud that Help One Now courageously led with its core values, taking a "people first" approach. We prioritized health and wellbeing while doing holistic and integrated interventions in all of our partner communities.

Impact Story

Sherie and Floyd Herbert were one of the first families to go through the Family Business Program in Belize. The Herberts live near one of the oldest Mayan ruins in Belize, a largely popular tourist destination. Upon graduating from the program, they opened a souvenir shop there and worked with local artisans to sell traditional wood carvings and crafts. Their business was a major success in their first year of operation, and they created stability for their family.

Like many business owners around the world, the Herberts faced a setback when the Covid-19 pandemic hit. Tourism in Belize came to a halt, and they were forced to close their shop. The Herberts had some savings built up from their profits, but as the pandemic progressed, they knew they had to find a way to generate income. Sherie took action immediately and began creating a new business plan.

The Herberts had some extra land on their property, so they started planting crops to sell in the local markets. Sherie also opened a window shop out of their home to sell their produce and other household goods. Being in a more rural area, their shop filled a significant need in the community and was immediately successful! The Herberts built their savings back up and got themselves back on their feet.

The country has now opened for travel again, so the Herberts reopened their tourist shop and hired a new employee to help run it. Their family now has three successful businesses! The Herberts are creating a sustainable future for themselves, as well as using their success to create jobs and impact their community.

Angel Di Maria is a 4th-grade student who exemplifies the transformative power of education.

Angel is a 9-year-old boy who lives with his loving grandparents in Peru. They took over care of him when he was very young. Tight finances and lack of resources made it difficult for them to provide the care Angel needed. Angel went to a local public school with little investment in the students and little access to nutritious meals.

All of that changed when Angel's grandparents learned about Colegio Kairos, the Help One Now supported school in Peru! Angel's grandparents told the Kairos team about their circumstances, and the team gave Angel a scholarship to start school right away! Additionally, the school needed a new cleaning staff member, so they hired Angel's grandfather for the position. Angel's family now has a stable income and a renewed sense of hope for the future.

As with many students, the Covid-19 pandemic has created many challenges for Angel's studies. However, thanks to support through The Circle, Angel has the resources he needs to succeed in school and improve his grades this year. He loves his school and misses his peers, but he is thankful for the opportunity to continue his studies online and soon even in person!

Angel's grandparents are incredibly grateful for Kairos and the opportunities they've provided for their grandson. They now have the support they need and are confident that Angel's education will open many new doors for him.

Impact Story

Ziada Semed is an energetic and bright 3rd-grade girl living in Gunchire town, Ethiopia, with her mother and five siblings. Ziada dreams of becoming a teacher to provide kids just like her with a quality education one day.

To bring Ziada's dream to life, she joined the Help One Now sponsorship program, which supports her school fees and helped provide her with school supplies such as a backpack, books, pens, and masks for class. With this support, Ziada gained new confidence and could focus on her education rather than her family struggling to meet her needs.

Ziada's mother was also able to go through the Family Business Program and start her own small dairy cow business. This business has provided enough income for the family to get back on their feet and create a pathway to a sustainable future.

When she grows up, Ziada hopes to be successful enough to support her family and give back by helping other children who are vulnerable in the community.

The restorative community care that we are doing is critical because we believe it is essential for us to live to help others live. It is vital to help others help themselves. Keeping families together is very important for us. It is important to make sure the families have everything they need to take care of themselves so that even in the middle of difficult situations, the families can stay together and flourish.

Our clean water initiatives help provide water for the schools and families in the community, and our feeding programs have been life-changing for our people in Haiti. But the most important restorative care we provide is spiritual development. Making sure the entire person and the whole family are cared for is key to changing communities forever.

Donor Interview: Tyler & Amy Price



Our donor community is the backbone of our work around the world. Your generosity and commitment to ending the cycle of poverty is the force that drives and sustains family empowerment. We want to honor and highlight that commitment each year, so we recently sat down with donors Tyler & Amy Price to hear what being part of the Help One Now family means to them.

How did you first hear about Help One Now?

(Amy) When we first moved to Austin from Kansas City, about 11 years ago, we were going to the Austin Stone Church, and Chris Marlow came over to speak to our small group about this new charity work that he was doing. We all sponsored a child in Haiti that night, and we just continued to do that through the years and donate every once in a while. We really loved what he had to say and loved the organization. We loved that it was new, and at the time, it was in Haiti, and we had known people that had just adopted from Haiti. We continued that until we started going to Austin New Church and got more involved and saw

the growth that had happened after that. So we started with Chris, started small, and then continued until we learned more, knew more, and saw that growth.

What does generosity and doing good around the world mean to you and your family?

(**Tyler**) We've been blessed to have what we have and then in our hearts to be able to give in places like Haiti and organizations like Help One Now, and it's been really awesome to see the growth. We haven't been able to go there physically, but we know we can do something. Both are essential - you have the goers and the doers, but you need both. So it's really nice to see how both can coincide, and we can still be a part of that.

(Amy) I think too when we started a family; we just wanted to instill into our kids that no matter what our situation is at the time we want to give, sacrificially giving or giving out of abundance. We've taken our kids to volunteer because I want them to see it, and I want them to feel it, and I want them to know how lucky and fortunate they are. You don't want them to have any hardship because you love them so much, but you also want them to understand it. And I think as our lives have changed and seasons have changed, we don't get to go out and be the hands and feet as much. So we still want them to know that we're giving and we're giving toward causes that are legit and doing good work in the world, even though we can't go there right now.

We have our family motto that is Micah 6:8, and it has been for a long time - "To do justly, love mercy, and walk humbly with God." It's tattooed on our bodies, it's around our home, on our walls, and that's the thing we want to instill in our family.

What does Family Empowerment mean to you?

(Tyler) From my perspective, it's really about affording a family the opportunity to be empowered through education and valued work. Valued work means that they're doing work to not only help themselves but help others, and through that, they're valuable in their community, and they're becoming sustainable. It's durable over the long haul.

But first and foremost, I think it starts with education. And to get somebody an education, it's cliché to say, but it does change the world. It changes a family's world and their community around them.

(Amy) Education is such a way out, even here in America. Not only for a child to get an education and experience something that generations before them may have never had, but also for the families that get to have their kid in school. They then get to go to work and know their kids are safe and educated.

What are some of your favorite things about partnering with Help One Now?

(Tyler) For me, it's seeing the fruit of the labor and getting to hear the stories and take part. It's amazing that you and I get to sit at the table together, and I get to hear the stories and see the stories, how you're taking people with you on the journey. I think to me, that just allows a little bit more vulnerability on your part for Help One Now to say, here's what we're doing, we're not hiding anything. It allows people to transparently see what's going on. It's very open access. There's always that reservation that people may have in giving to a charity of how much is going to fully support the cause. And that's where I have affirmation with Help One Now that what we're doing is truly changing lives and not solely going to administration. It's truly going to impact the end-user, which is the person on the other side that we're affecting.

(Amy) Yeah, I agree that the people that started the organization and work closely with the organization are so reachable to us as donors. It's so transparent. And when you have an organization that is like that, I think it allows you to have more buy-in, and it allows you to then be so proud and bold to tell other people about it. So when we hosted our gathering in November and had people over, we were telling them about the organization that we love and support, and I felt confident to do that and ask for their money nonapologetically. Because I know where it's going, and they can see if they give \$1,000, this is the result. This is what's happening. They're supporting one family. You want to invest in companies and organizations that you're proud to ask others to do the same because you know the result.

Can you tell us more about opening your home last year to host a Help One Now Dinner Party? What was that experience like for you, and what did it mean to be able to share the HON story with your friends and family?

(Amy) We love hosting our friends and family in general. We love a big table and an open home. We hosted our dinner in place of a Friendsgiving, which we usually host. So this time, we said let's still gather, eat and drink, but we also want your money! Again, I can say that without apology because I know the people I invited, and I know that they had room to give, and I think it's a cause that is 100% the right place to give. It can be uncomfortable for some people, depending on who you are and the group you invite. But I would challenge people to get uncomfortable.

Brené Brown says you can either be courageous or comfortable. Every once in a while, it's okay to choose courage and to do something that takes you out of your box because you know it's for a greater purpose. I mean, who doesn't want to drink wine and eat good food and tell stories and meet new people and gather together? It doesn't have to be a giant gathering. It can be a few people. But you need to invite specific people who will come to that particular gathering with the purpose you have in mind.

I am honored to work in Malawi to empower families and facilitate growth and development in my community. With my background in public service, non-profit management, business development, and my partnership with Help One Now, I am committed to serving and empowering my community.

I recently had the opportunity to travel to Ethiopia and visit my friend and Help One Now Global Empowerment Director, Aschalew Abebe. Aschalew is an incredible friend and has a well of knowledge in development work, and I was excited to learn from him.

Heading to Ethiopia, I felt hopeful and expectant for everything I would experience there and how I could use what I learned to help impact my community. After hearing many success stories, I couldn't wait to see the work being done to empower families, students, and communities in Ethiopia.

Upon arrival in Addis Ababa, I met up with Aschalew right away. He was extremely hospitable and immediately welcomed me into the community and culture. We attended a church service, ate at a local Ethiopian restaurant, and began visiting a few of Help One Now's initiatives.

Throughout my time in Ethiopia, I was able to experience the Family Business Program through the lens of the families who have participated in it. The ways their lives have changed since starting their small businesses is phenomenal. The impact will last for generations to come!

Each of these businesses was unique and suited the skills and resources of the business owner perfectly. Not to mention their businesses are filling the needs in their community.

For example, one business that we visited was a grocery store. The owner runs her store as a quick roadside shop out of her home, selling snacks, drinks, and other goods. Both of her daughters help her with the business. The family has established personal savings with their business success and is saving with a microfinance group! There is a lot of foot traffic from the busy road bringing customers to her shop, leaving exciting expansion opportunities.

Another business we visited was completely different! It was a stationery shop run by college graduates. Their team is exceptionally talented and creative. They are located in a heavily populated area near the university and already dream of expanding to include graphic designing and t-shirt printing.

We also visited coffee shops, farms, livestock businesses, and more! Each business requires unique skills, resources, and knowledge, presenting new challenges and growth opportunities.

The beautiful thing about each family we visited is that they have each created their own business that perfectly suits them and their community. This model empowers the family, provides the community with needed resources and supports the local economy. The ripple effect of empowering one person impacts so many lives.

Changing a community at the core takes partnership on many levels. Thanks to the partnership with the Ethiopian government for sustainable land permits, many of these businesses could thrive. Thanks to the global partnership, each business's startup opportunities are made possible by those who have generously donated to the Family Business Program. On a global level, partnership and community with Aschalew in Ethiopia will bring change to my community in Malawi.

I am so grateful for the time I spent in Ethiopia. It was a blessing to visit with Aschalew and see the life-changing work happening across the country!
