

Expense Percentage Chart



Leader Interview: Mercedes & Willie Malpartida



Help One Now empowers local leaders through friendship and partnership. We work with leaders who are already working effectively in their respective communities. These leaders are our friends and partners on the journey to end extreme poverty. They are our greatest resource, and sustainable change is impossible without them.

Mercedes and her son Willie are the directors of Kairos Ministries in Iguitos, Peru. Nearly 20 years ago, Noe & Mercedes Malpartida (Willie's parents) launched Kairos. Since then, they have been tirelessly building bridges in their community by providing quality education and care for vulnerable children, counseling and support to struggling families, and empowerment through the Family Business Program. Mercedes, a strong and passionate woman, alongside Willie, took up the reins of Kairos Ministries when Noe tragically passed away years ago. They lead well and have an expansive vision for the future and how they can empower their community to flourish!

Can you briefly introduce yourselves and tell us about where you work in Peru?

(Mercedes) Hola! I'm Mercedes, and I'm an educator by trade. I got my degree in education and also studied law. I'm the mother of three beautiful children, and it's a privilege to share with you what we do in our ministry. We have a church and are working to provide a strong education for our community's children.

Thank you for believing in Peru and working with us to bless and change lives. My city, lquitos, is very beautiful, but there is also a lot of poverty and need. We believe that God has planted us here so we can help and bless others to have more opportunities.

There were very poor families who maybe ate only once a day or not at all. In all these years, we've seen beautiful stories of transformation in those families. For example, they would sometimes not have even one meal a day. They were on scholarships to attend our school, and now they're professionals and standing on their own.

(Willie) I'm Willie Malpartida. Like my mom, I graduated from law school and am a pastor. We now have three campuses with our school. We're blessing children in Iquitos, San Juan, and Nauta. Nauta is one of the poorest communities in Peru, and we're taking a high-level education to these areas where the education has been bad for so many years.

Actually, Loreto, the state where Iquitos is, has the worst indicators of education, the worst in all of Peru. Out of 25 states in the country, we are in 25th place. But Kairos School is changing that. All of the students in the country have to take a test when they graduate to be able to go to university, and our kids always pass those tests. Our kids come from really broken backgrounds, but we've been able to change those lives and, through the gospel of Jesus, also bring restoration to the community. For many years now, through Kairos ministries, we have been able to help children, women, families, small businesses, and also survivors of human trafficking.

What led you to start your ministry in Iquitos, and why have you focused so much on quality education?

(Mercedes) I had gotten my education degree and taught in my early adult years. When we first started the church, I used my experience to serve the children. We saw the community's needs and that good education was not easy to find. My husband told me that God prepared me with my education studies to bless these children, more than just the once-a-week Sunday school. So we thought that we should maybe start our own school. We saw a lot of families suffering in our area, and we knew that a good education could change that.



We didn't have a sponsorship program, donations, or any help from an organization, but we wanted to help the children. We started small and did what we could. We started with sharing some food with the kids who needed it. We bought their uniforms and got them their books and other needs. And then it continued to grow from there into what it is now.

We wanted to rescue the children from their environment, and we knew that education was the best way to transform not only their lives but also the lives of their families and communities.

(Willie) As my mom said, she and my dad started the school in Iquitos and opened another campus where the city was growing and there was a lot of need, called San Juan. But not long after opening that second campus, my dad got sick and passed away from cancer. At that time, I was leading worship in a very big church in Lima and chasing my career in music. But Lunderstood that if I didn't return to Iquitos, no one would be there to help my mom in the ministry. I had worked with my dad all my life and knew everything that needed to be done.

So, it was easy for me to know what I needed to do. I didn't think twice about it because, for me, it wasn't a job; it was to continue the calling from God.
So I came back, and that first year was critical. We had many challenges, but we continued on. And then, only a couple of years after that was when we met Help One Now. Everything started to grow again from there, and now we have three school campuses blessing more lives and families.

How have you seen your work create a lasting impact in the community?

(Willie) I think one of the biggest things is the school. It has grown so much and is now recognized as one of the top schools in the region. We have seen the infrastructure grow around us, and the community improve because of it. Families have joined our different programs, and it has completely transformed their mindsets and life trajectories. The children also have opportunities and a future to look forward to because of our ministry and the education we provide.



(Mercedes) When we first started the ministry, we started small, and our infrastructure was simple. Because of the good work we've been able to do through the years, we've blessed more and more people in different areas. We've been able to grow and understand the needs of the people more, and we believe God is with us and behind the transformation we are seeing. We have been in education long enough now to fully see the cycle of poverty broken in families. Children are graduating and moving into successful careers. Their families have been able to sustain themselves in ways we never saw before. Young children are entering our school system and are in a place where their families no longer need scholarships or aid. There is still much work to do, but the change is happening. Those are the things that keep us doing what we are doing. It excites me and blesses me to see the results from generation to generation.

What does partnership with HON mean to you? And what impact does having an enduring friendship and partnership have on your work?

(Mercedes) It means a lot because it is very important to be able to make this ministry happen as a team. You can't do it by yourself on your own. Every member of the team makes this possible because we all provide something different to do a better job and serve more people. Everyone becomes a key part of the solution. The one who does the cleaning, the ones who do the paperwork, the teachers, the students and parents, those who support the ministry in prayer and encourage us, those who support Help One Now and our work together - each one is a key piece for the advancement of this ministry. It would not be possible if even one of those pieces were not in the equation. So, we really value those connections and our partnership together.

What are your biggest dreams for the future of Peru and the future of your ministry there?

(Mercedes) Well I am a Peruvian, and from the Loreto region. I want to continue advancing the progress of my region and making it better for everyone. I want to bring education and empowerment to even more families across the region. We must keep working to protect the most vulnerable and care for the community.

Not only through Kairos School but through everything we do, we want to help change children's mindsets so that they have hope for life and a better future. We want to help them believe that there is something better and that they can accomplish that. One of the dreams I had with my husband was to make sure that no child in the region went hungry and that each had the opportunity for education. Little by little, we are working towards that.

(Willie) In my case, I really want to bring technical education to the area. I would love to have a training school for kids who graduate that will only take six months or so to learn a trade. They can learn social skills, mental skills, emotional skills, and also a specific skill to start a career. There's so much need for that here. Only two percent of the population that graduate from secondary school go on to finish university or some other form of post-secondary education. Two percent! I would love to train the youth and give them the tools to follow their spirit of entrepreneurship and believe in themselves.

We also want to continue providing better school education to the entire region of Loreto. We started by expanding to Nauta, and the government is beginning to take notice and help us there. We believe we can offer the best education available to more and more communities in the years to come. We also want to continue creating opportunities to support families in those communities and give them the space to dream for something better.

Is there anything else you would like to share with our Help One Now family?

(Mercedes) I want you all to know that I am praying for you also and that we are very grateful for you believing in us. We are very thankful for all you have helped us accomplish; we know and feel that we are not alone in this. I'm convinced that this calling is not just a season; it is a state



of life and mind. To understand that if God blesses us, it is to continue blessings for others. Maybe we cannot always bless others in the same way, but we can do something with whatever God gives us. So let's keep going together. Let's keep serving and doing this work together as long as God allows us to!



Board Introduction

In recent years, I've been able to attend a Refuge retreat with other leaders in both Montana and Wyoming, spending time recharging and brainstorming ways to extend the impact we can have in this mission. There's something about feeling small that creates a sense of urgency to make our time "count." While the magnitude of change required can be overwhelming at times, the truth is that it starts with small actions. A good friend of mine once shared that doing good is simple, and it can start with helping one person. Let's make 2024 a truly transformative year for HON and, in turn, for our local leaders and their communities around the globe. Together, we can use our gifts, talents, passions, and resources to help end extreme poverty.

Impact Story

Take a moment to put yourself in the shoes of someone surviving in extreme poverty. You're making less than \$2.15 US per day and trying to support yourself and your family. Maybe you have to make difficult decisions about who gets to eat which meal each day, or perhaps you're overwhelmed by the hand you've been dealt.

You know you're smart and capable, but you lack the capital to launch your business as you need to. This is where Tseganesh found herself just a few years ago. When she had the opportunity to go through our Family Business Program, she knew she could take her business to the next level, and she did.

Post empowerment, she has hired employees and started a second business. She is feeding her children every day and sending them to school. And, she is dreaming of future growth and possibilities for the first time in her life.

Uganda generally faces many challenges in providing quality, affordable, and accessible education to its people, especially the young generation. In rural areas like Mayuge district, government services like education are hardly felt.

In light of this, in 2009, we started His Mercy Primary School in Mayuge District to address the educational challenges the community was facing by providing quality education and sponsorship to young children who would otherwise have no opportunity to access basic education.

Over the years, these rare education opportunities have enabled many of our young people from impoverished backgrounds to leave the shackles of extreme poverty by following their dreams and gaining employment opportunities post-education. These children have been, through education, empowered to participate in decision-making to build a better future for themselves and their communities.

We thank our partners and donors who have helped us restore the dreams of many young people and walked with us in this great and humbling journey of community transformation. I can confidently say from first-hand experience that education changes lives and restores hope in our communities. God bless you all!

We all know the frustration and anxiety of being locked out of your home. We will try anything to get in. A back door, a window, anything it takes. Remember the joy and relief of stepping inside after being locked out.

Now consider the frustration and anxiety of being locked out of opportunity.

Ydekel Capellan grew up in Barrio Maria Auxiliadora, one of the Dominican Republic's least-resourced neighborhoods at the time. When he was of elementary age, Ydekel independently decided to start selling cookies on the street. The profits from his hustle supported some needs for himself and his mother. He was searching for an open door and found a cracked window.

By the time he was 10, Ydekel had been given a scholarship and welcomed into the T.E.A.R.S. School, an initiative started by local leader Rod Davis. Ydekel became one of the first high school graduates from

T.E.A.R.S. and continued on to earn his Bachelor's Degree in Marketing and Communications.

Today, Ydekel runs his own athletic apparel business, referees international soccer matches, and works for T.E.A.R.S. and Help One Now as the manager of the Family Business Program.

Through the Family Business Program, Ydekel has helped empower over 30 families in Barrio Maria Auxiliadora to start, grow, and sustain their own micro businesses. These families are his neighbors and are part of creating new opportunities for their community together, increasing their monthly income, and creating sustainability for the future.

For Ydekel Capellan, admission into the T.E.A.R.S. school was like finding a hidden key under a doormat. And now, through the Family Business Program and T.E.A.R.S. School, he's unlocking even more opportunities for others.

During Gunchire's orphaned children crisis, it must have felt worrisome to dream of a day when every child had a family. Back then, it likely felt frightening to imagine what legalizing and normalizing local adoption practices would require. In the midst of this struggle, it surely felt terrifying to envision a reality where all families in the region were flourishing, and child abandonment was no longer a concern.

But today, the Gunchire region no longer suffers from an orphaned child crisis. In fact, this region that used to have one of the highest rates of abandoned children now has none.

This is all because of that improbable dream Aschalew believed so deeply in. Because of the holistic strategy to not just address the orphan crisis but also to set families up to flourish on their own and never have to make the impossible choice of whether they could afford to keep their children.

Ferrier 10-Year Celebration

2023 marked ten years since the opening of Ferrier Village! The Village has acted as not only a haven for vulnerable children, but also a beacon of hope and catalyst for community transformation.

Over a decade ago, the problem of child trafficking across the Haitian-Dominican border was brought to our attention. We researched, asked questions, listened, and learned. The vision of Ferrier Village was born. Funds were raised, houses were built, and those houses became homes

to beautiful children and dedicated house moms. Along the way, we turned our gaze upstream, realizing that poverty alleviation, community resilience, and opportunity are effective safeguards against trafficking. Ferrier Village became a catalyst for community transformation, hope, and progress in northeast Haiti. This includes clean water, early childhood development, solar power, secondary school, community agriculture, the Family Business Program, and much more. As they say, it takes a Village.



Just as the community of Ferrier has seen a lot of change these past ten years, so has the world...for better or worse. The cost of everything has increased significantly. And the children who came to the Village as 3, 4, and 5-yearolds are now teenagers...we even have a young lady who will begin her senior year of high school this Fall! We've managed to keep things moving in the right direction, but we need your help to build a bridge to the next ten years of Ferrier Village.

As we celebrate ten years of rescue and progress, we increased our Ferrier child sponsorships from 5 to 7 sponsorships per child in order to sustain the Village into the future. When the Village first opened, it took around \$200 a month to care for each child, but with inflation and other factors, it now takes \$280 per child. Here are a few things we would love for you to consider as we push to fully sponsor all of the children at Ferrier Village:

- 1. Invest further into the child you already sponsor and cover some or all of their empty sponsorship slots
- 2. Consider sponsoring another child at the Village

Our donor community is the backbone of our work around the world. Your generosity and commitment to ending the cycle of poverty is the force that drives and sustains family empowerment. We want to honor and highlight that commitment each year, so we recently sat down with donors Jonathan & Maria Fleisher to hear what being part of the Help One Now family means to them.

How did you first hear about and get involved with Help One Now?

Two of our closest friends have been involved with Help One Now for many years. We were first introduced at a dinner at one of their houses, where we heard about the vision and have continued to get more involved over the years. Last year, I (Jonathan) went on a trip to the Dominican Republic. Seeing the work, and talking with the local leaders completely blew me away. Their passion and personal sacrifice to plant churches and help people in their communities build better lives were incredibly inspiring and convicting. I got back from that trip and knew that we wanted to get more involved.

What resonates most with you about Help One Now's model and mission?

We really appreciate the partnership with local leaders. We love the idea of helping to resource those who are closest to the need. This approach requires humility and a recognition that we don't have all the answers. There are already high-capacity local leaders who have so much to teach us about what it means to live a life of sacrifice and love our neighbors. We so appreciate HON's commitment to identifying strong local leaders and allowing them to lead.



What does it mean to be generous as a family and community? How have you engaged with others around you as you partner with HON and our work around the world?

We believe that everything we have comes from and belongs to the Lord, and giving it away to those in need is an essential part of the Christian faith and an antidote to becoming too attached to wealth and things. We have parents and grandparents who have beautifully modeled living modestly and giving generously. And, although we regularly fall short of this goal, we attempt to apply this principle in our own family. I honestly don't think you could leave a trip like the one we did with HON in the DR and not feel inspired and excited to give more to support the amazing work that is being done, particularly in light of the daily sacrifices made by the leaders on the ground. It is a great privilege to be able to give directly to a project that I was able to see firsthand and know the impact that gift will have. It probably sounds cheesy, but we genuinely get more fulfillment and enjoyment from thinking about how our gift will benefit people I met in the DR, than if we had spent it on something for ourselves here at home.

We have these conversations with our kids regularly in the hope that they will grow up to give generously, not out of obligation or guilt, but because it is truly good for your soul. The more we have gotten involved with Help One Now, the more we have seen the beauty of the work that is happening there and its impact on improving communities around the world. When you see impact like this, you want to invite your friends to be a part of it. We will both be going on a HON trip to Peru later this year with a group of other couples who are our close friends, and are working with our church to plan another trip to the DR this fall. As soon as our kids are old enough, we also want to take them on a trip as we know it will have a life-long impact.

Could you share one of your favorite memories from a Help One Now trip or gathering?

Last year, I was able to go on a trip to the Dominican Republic with several people from our church and small group. Every night during the trip, we spent time under a gazebo with local leaders, processing what we saw and what it means to live lives of faith. Hearing their stories and the ways they have chosen to live so sacrificially for the sake of the gospel and other people was enormously impactful. Things said under that gazebo regularly come to mind in my day-to-day life. Being able to learn from those leaders and experience it with some of my closest friends was incredibly special and has led to continued conversations back home about ways our community can be more missional, and more involved with Help One Now.
