# Some words from our CEO

One of our core values at Help One Now is transparency. In that spirit, I'm going to share from a raw perspective with you all as our supporters. I know you are proud to be a part of Help One Now, and we are proud to have you. I don't want this letter to feel sanitized, but I do want to provide context to what you will see in this year's report.

As you know, the last several years have been tumultuous for our organization, and while it is widely acknowledged that the pandemic hit us hard, I am not sure the continued ramifications are as widely understood.

For example, we normally take close to 100 people on trips each year, but from March 2020 through December 2022, we only took a total of 12 people to visit our communities. Not being able to travel to our communities, meet the local leaders, and see the work firsthand had a significant impact on our fundraising efforts. It has been a challenge, to say the least, to continue to grow our new donor base without the ability to offer the experience of a Help One Now trip.

In 2024, I am pleased to say that we were able to return to planning and leveraging trips as a critical part of our donor recruitment and retention efforts, with over 70 individuals participating in trips throughout the year!

The nonprofit sector as a whole saw many shifts and downturns this year. As inflation grew and consumer confidence began to wane, each dollar was being stretched as far as possible. Thankfully for us, existing donors and supporters remained steady, but

new growth opportunities were harder to come by. Thankfully, at the end of 2023, we began to see some new and powerful momentum that spilled over to start 2024.

2024 was a powerful year for Help One Now. With 20 trips and new events, including our largest ever single fundraising event, we began to see our new donor base rebound and the future of Help One Now stabilize.

2025 is critical; there is no other way to say it. This is the year I am confident we can see some significant breakthroughs that will catapult us into the future, setting the stage for the biggest year of impact in the history of Help One Now.

I want to thank our board, leaders, team, and supporters - we have endured much together. Now, we get to dream big again and ensure we build an organization that thrives for decades to come.

### My ask to each of you is this:

- 1) Pray for us.
- 2) Continue to support.
- 3) Be an advocate, and ask your family and friends to join our shared mission.
- 4) If you haven't yet, go on a trip! Invest in yourself, see the work, and connect with one another, our leaders, and the families we serve. This will be life-giving for you and our communities.

# Leader Interview

Help One Now empowers local leaders through friendship and partnership. We work with leaders who are already working effectively in their respective communities. These leaders are our friends and partners on the journey to end extreme poverty. They are our greatest resource, and sustainable change is impossible without them.

Rod (Rodrigo) Davis and his wife, Twila, lead an incredible team and ministry in La Vega, Dominican Republic. They have served the community for over 28 years now and have seen the lives of families completely transformed.

Students are in school, families are running their own businesses, there is access to clean water and nutritious meals, and the community as a whole has moved from extreme poverty to a place of thriving and growth.

If you have been lucky enough to go on a trip to visit Rod and see the impact of his ministry, you know how special it is to sit in the rotunda together and hear some of their incredible stories. This interview only scratches the surface of all that has been done in the Dominican Republic, and we can't wait to see what more we are able to do together in the years to come!

### Can you briefly introduce yourself and tell us where you work in the Dominican Republic?

Rod: My name is Roderick Davis. I am the founder of T.E.A.R.S. (True Evangelism Always Requires Sacrifice) Ministries. In 1995, T.E.A.R.S. was established in La Vega, Dominican Republic. The T.E.A.R.S. team works and lives in some of the poorest slums in this developing country to transform communities by sharing a holistic gospel and promoting community development. The goal is to help the villages become healthier, educated, spiritually vibrant, and economically stable - all rooted in the gospel.

What led you to start your ministry in La Vega, and how has your holistic approach to meeting the greater needs of the community made a difference (as opposed to just focusing on education, or church planting, or water, etc.)? Rod: As my wife and I started to consider global missions, we felt a real calling to the poorest of the poor. We decided on the Dominican Republic because of its extreme poverty. We didn't focus only on education, water, or one specific area. We lived with the community and experienced first-hand the people struggling with sickness, hunger, lack of educational opportunities, and multiple other needs. We realized that we needed to remove barriers to support actual, sustainable growth by working hand in hand with our neighbors. By addressing physical, emotional, social, and spiritual needs, we show the love of Christ in action, not just words.

How do you believe we are called to break the cycle of spiritual poverty to restore families and communities?

**Rod:** We must start at the root of the problem: hopelessness and poverty break up families.

It is hard for people who are hungry, sick, and without hope to hear the gospel. A good holistic approach focuses on immediate needs, such as food. Then comes empowerment - teaching skills, supporting education, developing local leadership, and encouraging entrepreneurship (FBP). Then, people begin to see their God-given potential.

Spiritually, we understand that Christ is the only one who can set people free. We proclaim Christ as Savior and the freeing power of the gospels. Secondly, to break the chains of physical poverty, education and empowerment are needed. Our belief is that those should happen at the beginning stages of childhood development. That is why the two main elements of T.E.A.R.S. Ministries are Church Planting (to address the spiritual need) and Education (to address the physical cycle of poverty). These help to establish a solid functioning community.

Rod: Apart from the deep fellowship, this partnership enhances our ability to serve more effectively, gain access to resources and global support, and connect with a broader network of advocates who care about sustainable change. When teams visit and join in our mission, they have the unique opportunity to experience the local culture and daily life of the community first-hand. These visits are a chance to build meaningful relationships with the people we serve, forming bonds that go beyond a short-term trip. Team members actively participate in the ongoing work of education, empowerment, and transformation, becoming part of the long-term vision for sustainable change. As they return home, they don't leave the mission behind. Instead, they become advocates and ambassadors, helping to share the story, raise awareness, and gather support. These visits are not just about helping; they're about learning, partnering, and sharing the gospel through love and service.

What is one of your favorite things about the Dominican Republic? What are you most excited to show off when you have tea visiting?

Rod: As I walk through the slums of Maria Auxiliadora (our barrio), remembering horrible destitution (no water, no power, no schools, and no hope), I come to tears when I see the children playing in the streets, proudly wearing their school uniforms, healthy with dreams. The transformation of this community started over 30 years ago, hand in hand with the neighbors working to see change. One of my favorite things about the D.R. is its people. When teams visit, I want them to see our leadership, most of whom have been with us for over 20 years!

Rod: At T.E.A.R.S., we've been blessed to build an incredible team of passionate, mission-driven leaders who share a deep commitment to Christ and our community. This shared leadership model has been transformational. By empowering others to lead and take ownership, we've been able to multiply our impact, stay focused on our core values, and remain adaptable to the needs around us. Everyone brings unique gifts to the table, and together, we move with unity and purpose far beyond what any one person could accomplish



# Trips Highlights

Our trips are one of our favorite parts of the work we do together because we believe that friendship and connection are the core of who we are. These trips allow us to build deeper relationships with our local leaders and their teams, get to know the families that your generosity is supporting, and celebrate all that we are accomplishing together - in person, in the communities we are supporting! ### **Letter from Pastor Jean Alix Paul**

Hello everyone! I send my greetings to you from Haiti, along with my family and our ministry. I have been partnering with Help One Now since 2010, and we have been doing many things together that help us break the cycle of poverty in each of the communities where we work here in Haiti.

I would like to personally thank our donors and partners in our ministry. Thank you very much. We really appreciate your help and support, and we cannot do it without you. May God bless you.

In the last three years, our ministry has been affected by the gang violence in Haiti. More than 500 schools have been closed, the gangs have displaced more than 600,000 people, and over 5,000,000 people are starving; people can not travel and go about their normal lives.

Our school in Ferrier has been a source of hope in the community because we provide the best education in the northeast of Haiti. We make sure we have the best teachers. We give all our students books and notebooks. We give them a hot meal every day. In Haiti, the government provides free education for less than 20% of the children, and that's the reason why we are doing what we are doing.

Ferrier Village and the schools are such crucial resources to the community and the future of Haiti. When we rescue kids from trafficking and put them in school, we help them to develop their potential and become men and women who can reach the communities and change the country.

But our ministry has also been affected by the financial challenges that have hindered the ministry and work in Ferrier. We have 200 people working full time for us, and inflation has hit us really hard. Prices of goods have been sky high, and things are difficult to get.

Right now, we have had a decrease in funding and have had to make hard decisions about what work we can keep doing. I am asking you, brothers and sisters, to help us in this difficult situation. I am asking you not to forget Haiti and to believe in the change we can still make together. We really need your help to keep doing our ministry, and I strongly believe we can continue to break the cycle of poverty for families in Haiti.

Please keep us in your prayers and join us in supporting our children.
